See It: (Small Group Questions)

Text: Jeremiah 33:14-26

Big Thought: Get ahead on what you want to leave behind

1. To you, what is the most beautiful part of the picture that God paints in Jeremiah 33:14-26?
 - How do you think this picture changed people who believed it in Jeremiah's day?

2. When Jeremiah says "the day will come," he reminds us of the sovereign purposes and plans of God that gives us hope for our future. God is writing a story in the history of humanity and his purposes cannot be thwarted. Who do you know who seems to have the most hope for the future? Do you think their hope is sound or misplaced?
 - Who do you know who has the least hope for the future? Do you think their hopelessness is sound or misplaced?

3. The quest to leave a lasting legacy begins by getting in early on the legacy that God himself is leaving in the world. By understanding and living consciously in God's story, we find that our own personal stories gain their greatest significance. What motivates a person to live a life that leaves a legacy? As a group, list three things.
 - Which of these things motivate you most?

4. What is the most precious legacy that has been left to you?
 - Do you think the person or people who left that legacy knew they were doing it? Why do you think that?

5. Leaving a lasting legacy will not always be easy. But if we persevere it is possible. Pastor, church planter and author Neil Cole said, "Finishing well is not what we do at the end of our lives; it's what we do every day of our lives." What's the one big takeaway for you from this study that you can act on tomorrow to help you leave a lasting legacy?
