"He was praying in a certain place, and when He finished, one of His disciples said to Him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John also taught his disciples.'" Luke 11:1 (CSB)

"Yet He often withdrew to deserted places and prayed." Luke 5:16 (CSB)

Prayer should be so important to us as Jesus' disciples because prayer was something Jesus prioritized.

Jesus prayed on purpose.

Prayer is an intimate conversation with the one who passionately loves and lives in you.

"Therefore, let us approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in time of need." Hebrews 4:16 (CSB)

The goal of prayer is not to get more from God, the goal of prayer is to get more of God.

Prayer is how we go after the heart of God so we can have a relationship with the God of our hearts.

Seven Practices on Prayer from Jesus, the Master Teacher:

#1 - Keep it Real.

"5Whenever you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites, because they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by people. Truly I tell you, they have their reward. But when you pray, go into your private room, shut your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you." Matthew 6:5-6 (CSB)

Religion demands prayer to be professional, presentable, and for public praise.

A Relationship with Jesus moves us to delight in prayer being personal, private, and powerful.

The secret to prayer is prayer in secret.

#2 - Keep it Simple.

"When you pray, don't babble like the Gentiles, since they imagine they'll be heard for their many words. *Don't be like them, because your Father knows the things you need before you ask Him." Matthew 6:7-8 (CSB)

#3 - Keep it Worshipful.

"Therefore, you should pray like this: Our Father in heaven, your name be honored as holy." Matthew 6:9 (CSB)

A prayerful life is a worshipful life.



#4 - Keep it Surrendered.

"Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Matthew 6:10 (CSB)

When we surrender to God's kingdom and will, we are requesting that our lives align with God's kingdom story.

Sometimes prayer changes things. Most of the time, prayer changes me.

#5 - Keep it Practical.

"Give us today our daily bread." Matthew 6:11 (CSB)

"Don't worry yourself to death, pray yourself to peace." - Chad Veach

#6 - Keep it Repentant.

^{"12}And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. ¹³And do not bring us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." Matthew 6:12-13 (CSB)

#7 - Keep it Persistent.

⁴⁴Remain in Me, and I in you. Just as a branch is unable to produce fruit by itself unless it remains on the vine, neither can you unless you remain in Me. ⁵I am the vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in Me and I in him produces much fruit, because you can do nothing without Me." John 15:4-5 (CSB)

Something changes when prayer is no longer just one more thing in our day, but becomes the most important thing.
